## Diane Faile & Helen Davis, LUNCH WITH SANTA



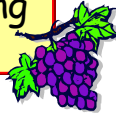

## ACCOUNTANT'S COMPILATION REPORT

I have compiled the accompanying statement of receipts collected, disbursements paid and changes in fund balance--cash basis of the Fairview Park Junior Women's Club for the year ended May 31, 2011 in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

The Club's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles; consequently, certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred except for scholarships which are recognized when the expense is determined.

A compilation is limited to presenting in the form of financial statements information that is the representation of management. I have not audited or reviewed the accompanying financial statement and, accordingly, do not express an opinion or any other form of assurance on it.

Management has elected to omit substantially all of the disclosures ordinarily included in this financial statement prepared on the cash basis of accounting. If the omitted disclosures were included in this financial statement, they might influence the user's conclusion about the Club's assets, liabilities, net assets, receipts and disbursements. Accordingly, this financial statement is not designed for those who are not informed about such matters.
